This Week

- **FS** – learning about Diwali and the story of Rama and Sita – making Diva Lamps and Mehndi patterns.
- **Drewton** – performed a fantastic Fire of London themed assembly – the teachers and parents were so proud of the confident and expert speaking, dancing and singing.
- **Sugarloaf** – festive and Northern Lights artwork. Positional language and measuring in maths. Designing a Stuart style house that would have been around in 1666.
- **Sandholme** – learning how global warming damages the Polar Regions.
- **Barmby** – continued our topic work on the Polar Regions, finding out about climate change and the Northern Lights. Written information text about the Arctic and Antarctic.

- **Drax** – drafting and re-drafting of persuasive writing.

- **Hensall** – investigating water resistance. Completing a history quiz on the Ancient Greeks.
- **Upton** – Testing paper boats to see which design held the most plastic counters. Evaluating instructional texts.
- **Cudworth** – mass Roman and Celt slaughter on the playground. Carving Roman tiles. Making and eating ancient Roman breakfast pancakes with figs and honey.
- **Hemsworth** – mixed numbers and improper fractions in maths.
- **Whole school** – Our grand stocking filler fair was a wonderful day of helping small businesses and Christmas shoppers in the community. We were incredibly honoured to sing (and play) for Santa last Sunday – we led his float in the grand Princes Quay Parade, switched on the Princes Quay Lights and entertained an incredible 6,000 people! Mega Switch Off week was an eco-award energy saving education. The children were brave and sensible when they received their flu vaccinations. The Year 6 classes had a fantastic, if a little brutal, Mega Roman and Celt Day. The Year 4 children learned excellent Pedestrian Skills including road safety and the Green Cross Code.
