

Numeracy

This term the children will continue to be taught in year group sets for Numeracy and we will continue to follow the Abacus mathematics planning framework.

The children will be taught how to use and apply their mathematical skills with a focus on how they use written and mental methods. When the children complete work involving adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing numbers they will be encouraged to regularly check their answers and be expected to try and explain their understanding and reasoning to other children.

We will plan opportunities for the children to solve a variety of real life problems involving measures, data handling, shape and space.

Literacy

The children this term will be taught in year groups for Literacy and as much as possible our work will link to our topic of 'Ancient Greece' for Year 5 and 'Roman Britain' for Year 6. During the term, the children will have opportunities to study and write historical texts, recounts, myths and legends, information texts, explanation texts and poetry. We will continue to teach reading skills through shared reading and through guided group reading within and outside the literacy hour. As always the children are encouraged to develop their understanding of the structure of a text and to analyse words used by an author.

Topic

The history topic this term for Year 5 is 'Ancient Greece', where we will study what it was like to live, work and play during those times and how their legacy influences modern life. The science topics Year 5 will study this term are 'Earth and Space' and 'Forces'. Year 6 will be studying Roman civilization, in particular the invasion of Britain and the effect that had on our country's subsequent development. The science topics Year 6 will study this term are 'Light and Dark' and 'Electricity'.

French

French continues to be taught this term in both year groups. The Year 6 children will continue to have weekly lessons taught by visiting Wolfreton language teachers, in order to prepare them for the KS3 Modern Foreign Languages curriculum.

PE times

All the children in year 5 and 6 have a weekly PE session, which will primarily be taught outside, weather permitting. Children are required to wear the school PE kit, consisting of black shorts, white polo shirt and sandshoes or trainers. Please also include jogging trousers and a long sleeved top for the colder weather.

The sessions take place as follows:

Upton and Hensall - Monday

Cudworth and Hemsworth - Friday

Class Reading Books

Each class has its own class library and children are encouraged to change their library books frequently. Children who are not yet free readers should read to an adult at home daily. Children who are free readers naturally read independently at home, however, we do encourage these children to also read to an adult at least 3 times per week.

Homework

Pupils will continue to receive the following homework this term:

- Spellings - children will be given a new list of spellings each week, which they must take home and write sentences incorporating the words. The completed sheets can be returned at any time and smile rewards will be given to the children for producing interesting and appropriate sentences.
- Times Table Platforms - the children all have their own individual times table platform sheet. The children must be able to recite the table in the order it appears and answer questions in random order to achieve a platform.
- Reading - whether your child reads the school reading scheme books or if they are a free reader they are encouraged to take home and read their reading book on a regular basis. The children are given opportunities to change their books during our guided reading sessions.
- Half term homework - for the first half term year 5 will bring home a weekly piece of reading comprehension work; for the second half term the children will be doing a science project - information for this will be given nearer the time. Year 6 have a weekly reading comprehension and a numeracy piece of homework that help to support and reinforce the work the children have completed in lessons that week.
